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Use of PE Premium at Stephen Freeman 2016/17

Funding is provided to ensure schools achieve self-sustaining improvement in the quality of PE and sport in Primary Schools, securing improvement in the following areas:

1. The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity, kick starting healthy active lifestyles.
2. The profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole-school improvement.
3. Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport.
4. Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to pupils.
5. Increased participation in competitive sport.

In 2015/16, the school received £9,198 of funding and spent it in the following ways:

Priorities 2 and 3 - Sports coach was employed to work with children from Nursery to Year 6. Sports Coach taught alongside the class teachers, modelling key teaching skills needed to secure progress. £ 7000	Children were participating in a wide variety of sport provision.
