### Attendance Newsletter

Dear Parents and Carers,

**Welcome to our first Attendance Newsletter.** The purpose of this newsletter is to highlight the importance of attendance and punctuality. **At Stephen Freeman School we have been working really hard to raise attendance levels and to reduce the instances of lateness.** This is being monitored very closely—by us a school, by our governing body, by our local authority. The expectation is for school attendance to be 97%. Currently our school attendance—at 95% - falls below this. Although this does actually sound like quite a high percentage, this actually equates to 2 whole weeks of learning lost.

The vast majority of our families achieve an attendance level of at least 96%, however, where families do not achieve a satisfactory level of attendance we will discuss this with you and see how we can support you to improve.

We do appreciate that children get ill from time to time – but there are primary schools in the UK achieving an overall level of attendance as high as 98% - well above the national average. **We hope you can support us in achieving our target — we can only do it with your support!**

There is much evidence to show that good attendance plays a vital role in helping children achieve their full potential. We also know that poor attendance can lead to other problems for children.

**Children who do not attend school regularly are more likely to:**

- Fall behind in their school work
- Find it difficult to make and keep friends
- Be unhappy at school
- Misbehave so that others cannot see they are finding the work difficult
- Learn poor behaviour habits that follow through into secondary school and employment.

## Celebrating Good Attendance

Firstly, and most importantly, a BIG well done and thank you to the **222 pupils who managed to get a 100% attendance certificate for Autumn Term 1**. 100% attendance really is a great achievement – and I'm sure those pupils and many more will aspire to reach this again!

In total, **243 children in school achieved our target of 97%** (that's 59% of children in school) so a big pat on the back to those children too. Well done!
