Find out what porridge is made from.

What does it look like before we buy it in the shop?



If Goldilocks tried all 3 bowls of porridge, all 3 chairs and all 3 beds, how many things did she try altogether?

Show how you worked it out by drawing what she tried and counting them.



Make a shoebox model of one of the scenes in Goldilocks, you could make the forest with the Bear's house in the middle or you could one of the rooms inside the house. Then you can bring it in and display it in class.



Think of some yummy ingredients you can add to porridge. You could try some and write down or tell us which was your favourite.



Use your story map to retell the story to someone at home.



Draw a picture of your favourite part of the story. You could use paint, crayon, chalk collage or pencils. Label your picture or write a sentence to describe what is happening.



Make a new chair for baby bear to replace the one that Goldilocks broke. You could use card, blocks, boxes or anything else you can think of. Bring it in to show us or you can put a picture on tapestry.



Visit the library to find a different version of the story. Perhaps you could borrow the book and bring it in for us to read.



Write a list of words to describe some of the things that Goldilocks tried at the bear's house. Draw pictures to go with your words.
