Create an article of Tudor jewellery using Salt Dough – you can make as many as you like!

Salt Dough Recipe

Ingredients

65g of salt

130g flour

180ml of water

(Recipe can be easily doubled if you want more
– not sure how much dough this makes!)

Instructions:

1. In a large bowl mix salt and flour together.
2. Gradually stir in water. Mix well until it forms a doughy consistency.
3. Turn the dough onto the bench and knead with your hands until smooth and combined.
4. Make your creations using the salt dough. You can cut the dough using a cookie cutter or using a butter knife.
5. Place the salt dough creations into the oven at 150C. The amount of time needed to bake depends on the size and thickness of the salt dough creations. (It can take up to three hours for it dry completely – it alternatively can be left in the sun during the day)



Tips & Ideas:

- Store your salt dough in an air tight container as it keeps well for a few days.
- Salt dough can also be aired dried and is an alternative to oven drying.


