

Practice writing your name. Make sure you write every letter correctly.

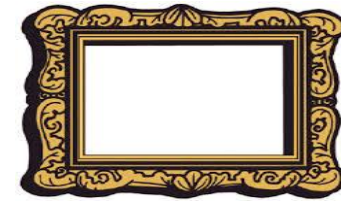
