

Year 2 Home Learning - Autumn 2 - The Great Fire of London

PARENTAL GUIDANCE NEEDED

Light a candle or watch a bonfire. Think about what you can see, hear, smell and feel. Write down your ideas.



Write your own fire poetry. Use the previous activity to help you with this.



The Great Fire of London started in a bakery. Pretend that you are baker, what can you bake at home?



Create some art inspired by 'The Great Fire of London'.



An idea of your own!



Find out more about fire safety. Create a poster to help others to stay safe.



What was life like in 1666? Do some research and present your findings in any way that you like.



Practise adding two-digit and one-digit numbers together e.g. $24+5$. Next try adding two two-digit numbers together e.g. $24 + 31$. Draw tens and ones to help you.

$$24 + 31$$

This term all of the children will be completing the 'Phonics Screening Check'. This involves reading a range of real and 'nonsense' words.

Start with phase 3 sounds and move onto phase 4 or phase 5 depending on your child's reading confidence.

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
