

Practise writing the first letter of your name. You could use your finger or a stick to write it in mud or sand, a paintbrush to paint it or a pen or pencil to write it on paper.



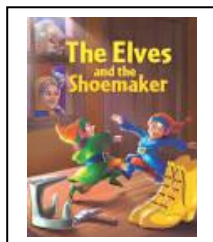
Can you spot any rhyming words in stories you hear at home? See if you can make up more rhyming words, they can be nonsense words if you like.



Make a model from bricks, blocks or junk modelling. Think about which shapes will fit together and which shapes are best for what you are making. It would be great to see photos on Dojo of your models.



Tell your grown-ups at home the story of The Elves and the Shoemaker which we will be learning in nursery this term. You could draw pictures to help you remember the story.

Find 5 of your favourite toys at home. Can you move them around to make pictures or patterns from them, e.g. can you make them into a house shape, or a face?
